Dear Friends and Supporters of CWA Children's Home

We are very happy to send you this newsletter directly from the CWA Children's Home. We have been back in Nepal for three weeks now and have been able to work a lot with the children.

#### New resident in our Home

Since the beginning of June, a new boy joined the CWA Children's Home Family - Prabin Thapa is eight years old and comes from the neighboring village of Sarangkot. His mother left three years ago and his alcoholic father disappeared six months ago. Since then, several families in the village had been taking care of Prabin, but he only occasionally attended school. Eventually, the youth welfare office was informed, and they prepared the appropriate documents to submit a request for Prabin's admission in our Home.

Prabin was admitted and he quickly found new friends in our Home. He now also attends school with the other kids on a regular basis.







## Change at the hostel

This spring, Binod [20] and Bibek [18] passed their 10th grade exams. Both passed with good marks and at the end of June, moved into our hostel. There they are currently living with Santosh and Bishal. Binod and Bibek both have started a two-year educational training at a College for Hotel Management.

Mid-April the new Nepali calendar year started. Meanwhile, the new school year has also started. All children passed their final exams and were transferred to the next class. Most were able to keep their grades at a good level. Now also our little 4-year old Roshani attends preschool. Here she proudly presents her school uniform.

### **Expansion of farming activities**

The additional fields developed and readied for farming in the spring are now being cultivated. The first tomatoes have already been harvested from the new greenhouse. In the summer holidays, the older boys started to dig out the fishpond.







Pokhara suffered heavy hailstorms in May, destroying most of the seedlings and the entire corn crop. As the rainy season started late this year, the children could help planting the rice during their summer holiday. That was fun for everyone.

#### Renewed "Grade A" award and audit

For the fourth year in succession, the CWA Children's Home has been awarded "Grade A" by the relevant authorities. Meanwhile, the CWA Home in Gandaki Province counts as the best run home (out of 69 Children's Homes). The success we achieved was only possible with the support of our sponsors and through the excellent work of our management team.

Regardless of the classification by the Nepali authorities, we ourselves check all records and accounts of the Children's Home on a regular basis. We can attest to 2018 being another year of flawless bookkeeping and transparency by the management team.
